## Letter to Judge Moore

Judge Moore,  
Nome, Alaska.

Dear Sir:-

We have to-day met and talked with President Roosevelt in regard to Alaska affairs, and as we promised you last Summer, we mentioned the difficulties you have in enforcing laws in that Country, i.e. in getting a jury to convict. He seemed much impressed when we stated to him that we thought you to be a good and conscientious Judge and thanked us warmly for the information, saying that some of the Alaska fellows had told so many tales about you that he had almost begun to doubt you. We handed him a copy of the statement made by the Eskimo girl, Elsie, against Tommie Noyes which we left with you. He said he would like to go up there himself and hang him, but that would be impracticable at present. He did not tell us what action he would take however,

We expect to come to Nome in the latter part of June en-route to our property on Hannum Creek where we will install machinery and spend the Summer in mining.
