October 16, 1911.

We are beginning to teach the young people to sing in the choir and will practice every Thursday evening, they are very interesting to Mrs Hare, and Mr. Arthe

It cost me \$16.40 to have it send up to Deering, Please do not worry about the school it worked out alright with Mrs Tope, We have 23 scholars now. The boat is going down so I have write to me often
