I know your three girls Vivian Gladys and Esther, They should know ^{me} for when Iva & I talk Eskimo they would say, Why you talk Eskimo? we ~~would~~ ^{used} to laugh at them, I stay whole week at your home with Iva, helping sew parkies and when I was going away, you send some clothes to my one year old sister Elsie, Now she is pastor too, over at Selawik. My oldest son James is a pastor too, at Noorvik last winter, now they came for spring and summer with me, and my two daughters Ruth and Anna very true children helping the church work in what they can, all these are in family's

I have 9 living children and 18 grandchildren. One of my youngest son Joshua out there at there, his address is Joshua Savok.
