Poots Vestal grandma died & also Kitty Well's mother this fall, Kitty mother was such a fine woman. We miss her very much.

Sam & Mary Morris have three boys & another baby came to them day before yesterday. A little girl, they were so pleased. They named her Martha. The mail just came yesterday and will leave this morning.

Very sorry to say Wheeler Douglas wife is not very strong in the Lord, and he always try very hard do to right. Did Martha tell you about me got married to Leo Augrook Faber on New Year day? We were married in the school room. Florence Wells walked with me. Fred Thomas & Leo and I walked behind them of course every body was in the school room and Mrs. Hare came round other way met us. It was very nice I thought & I had white dress on and he had new dark blue suit on, white collar, white shirt on. I pleased with him. I suppose he pleased of course, but he is way now down the herd helping the boys making ?...he has some deer there with the herd, about 10.

I am staying with the mission with Martha and we do have a good time together. It is time for breakfast now & I will close. Give my love to children and also to friends there round & pray for us here. With best love to all please write again. We are well here, hope you are the same.
