

Deering, Alaska

October 16, 1911

Dear Mrs. Foster,

When I wish to have a letter written I must do it. Are [sic] little family is well and happy & satisfy [sic] what we have. The natives are so good to us, they gave us 3 ptarmigans. We are having a fine meeting. The Holy Spirit is certainly is [sic] working among these Eskimos. We are beginning to teach the young people to sing in the choir and will practice every Thursday evening. They are very interesting to Mrs. Hare and Martha, to hear them singing in the school room. Ahperuk died after we left Koongngarook, wife and also Atlenik Jopsey Mills father. Wheeler Douglas went over to Kotzebue got a wife and seems to be happy. The man send my organ alright from Seattle but he did not but the stool in with the organ. I wish you would write to him and ask him why he didn't put it in. It cost me \$16.40 to have it send [sic] up to Deering.

Please do not worry about the school. It worked out alright with Mr. Lopp. We have 23 scholars now. The boat is going soon so ? write to me often. God bless you all. Pray for us and we will do the same.
